


## PBS CORNER

In week 5, our newly formed PBS committee attended a day of training, as we prepare to commence our journey to become a **PBS** school. PBS stands for **Positive Behaviour Support**, which encompasses a whole school community approach to developing a positive culture, deliver explicit teaching of expected behaviour and extensive data collection and analysis to guide our teaching practices.

Our team members are from lower, middle and upper primary years including education assistants, teachers and administrators. We have an internal and external coach, team leader, secretary and other very important roles. Our team will be meeting fortnightly to structure and deliver whole school curriculum, identify priority areas and sharing information among the school and wider community. On the 28<sup>th</sup> of November, we are conducting a school survey to determine a starting point to establish our expectations of behaviour and our shared vision.

Caralee Community School and the Fremantle Language Development Centre will work in conjunction on this project, and we will continue to teach our values program including the TED awards. We will get to a point where a parent representative will be included, so we look forward to further engaging with you all heading into this exciting mission to developing positive culture and engagement with our learners.

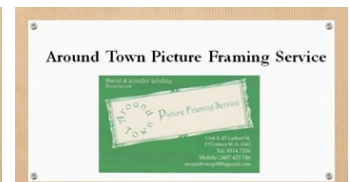
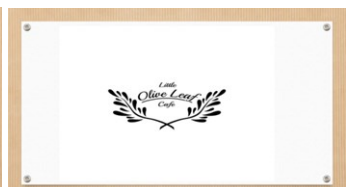
Raffle tickets for the Adult or Child Santa Sacks are still available from the school office.

## Grants make big impact

ONE local not-for-profit organisation will be \$100,000 better off when the Fremantle Foundation names its Impact100 winner on Thursday night.

On the 50th anniversary of the 1967 referendum, the Impact100 committee decided this year's grant would be awarded to an organisation

that works to support Aboriginal health and wellbeing.

This year's finalists are the Fremantle PCYC, Caralee Community School, MyKy and Ngalla Maya.

Fremantle Foundation's Hannah Fitch-Rabbitt said they received a number of strong applications and narrowing it down to four final

ists had been difficult.

"It is always incredibly difficult to select a final four, especially after attending the site visits and hearing first-hand how passionate and hardworking the organisations are," she said.

"These four projects are all quite different but each have incredible merit and

The annual Impact100 fundraiser asks 100 donors to give \$1000 each in support of local charities and programs.
