Teaching our kids about good saving habits!



The **School Banking** program has been run nationally by the Commonwealth Bank since 1931. All you need to get involved in the School Banking program is a Commonwealth Bank *Youthsaver* account. You can open an account for your child in one of two ways:

I. Online: Visit <u>commbank.com.au/schoolbanking</u> and click on the link to open a *Youthsaver* account.

2. In branch: Visit a Commonwealth Bank branch with identification for yourself and your child, like a driver's licence and birth certificate.

If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account, they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit on **School Banking Day** using their Dollarmites deposit wallet.

School Banking Day is <u>Thursday</u>. Each week you need to bring the deposit book up to the Front Office. You will also have the chance to receive a range of items to help you save.

By now you've probably heard about the introduction of the online environment called *Connect* in WA schools.

This article is about how *Connect* will be used in our school. *Connect* is a secure online environment developed by the Department of Education for staff, students and parents in public schools.

It will give our teachers a tool to deliver content to the students via an online classroom. This means your children will be able to share with you what they are learning.

For you, *Connect* provides easy access to information relevant to your child's classes and learning such as pictures and information about the class learning program for each term.

Class teachers can use *Connect* to keep you updated with important information however *Connect* will not replace notes home at this stage. Things like up-coming events, excursions, classroom activities, photos and stories can be sent to you via email or, if you prefer, via a push notification on your phone. Download *Connect Now* from the <u>Apple App</u> <u>Store or Google Play</u>.

You will soon receive secure login information to *Connect* via the email address we have on file for you. If you have recently changed your email address please let us know by phoning 9314 1677 or emailing the school at <u>caralee.cs@education.wa.edu.au</u> so we can update our details.

Caralee Early Years Community Playgroup

If you have a child or children under four years of age, you are invited to attend the Caralee Early Years Community Playgroup.

The playgroup provides a safe and stimulating environment for parents to interact with their child/children aged between birth and four in an informal play session.

The playgroup is run by the Fremantle Language Development Centre (LDC) in partnership with Caralee Community School and Supported by Meerilinga, a not-for-profit organisation that promotes positive childhoods.

The program is based on a "Family Partnership" model and recognises the parents as the child's first teacher and the importance of schools working closely with families and the community.
