## WINTER SPRINKLER SWITCH-OFF

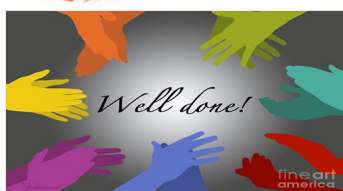
1 JUNE - 31 AUGUST

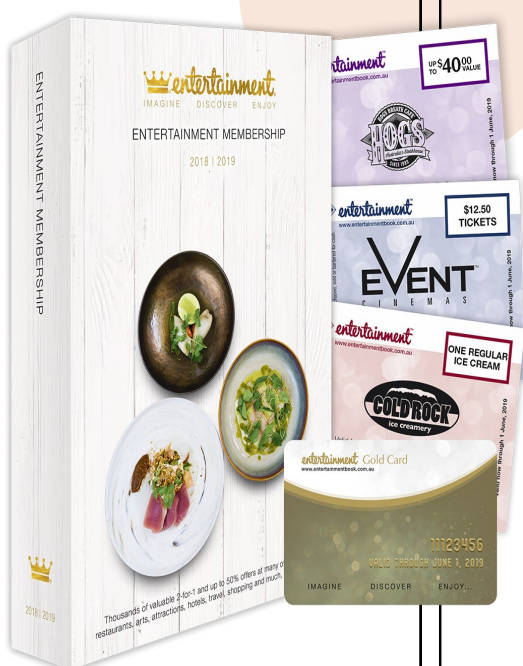
## PBS Mr Darron Acott
