Art

The last term provides a great opportunity for introducing students to a subject that we don't always think about: learning about great artists. Artists have a huge amount of influence on shaping history and culture, and it is a good idea to give kids a sense of how powerful art can be. Not only does this give them a greater understanding of the past, but it can also get them excited about what they will create in their future. In Week Three students were inspired by artist **Jackson Pollock**. They used different techniques to splatter paint onto paper. Such as flicking, drizzling, rolling and spraying.

As each student splattered paint onto their paper, I could see the mood change as some children felt frustrated as the paint wasn't drizzling fast enough, whilst others demonstrated sheer excitement at squirting water from a spray bottle onto their work to see the paint splat with affect and drip down their page. Parents and guardians are welcome to come visit the art room to view their child's work.





As of Week 5/6, selected classes will participate in decorating cupcakes - notes have been sent home to those classes, and Junior classes will be inspired to make salt dough in the art room and turn the dough into Christmas ornaments that they can hang at home.


Sport
