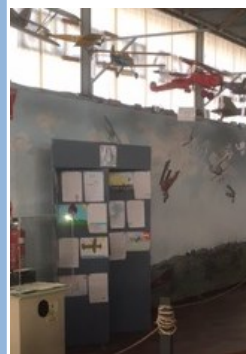
D2 Visit to the RAAFA
