This is the first newsletter entry I have written in a while as I have been on study leave in England and on Military Leave last week.

Mrs Norman has been looking after things during that time and has done a fantastic job. My trip to England was part of my final Masters of School Leadership unit with UWA, and was fortunately part of a scholarship I received called a Prince of Wales Award. The Royal Australian Air Force kindly provide the award so employers, who release staff to do Reserve service, are recognised. The study tour took in many universities such as Cambridge and Durham, as well as primary and secondary schools all over England. It was a great insight into the UK education system and some fantastic work schools are doing, particularly in early childhood education and 3 year old language support.

There is no point travelling across the world if it is not going to help Caralee. Thankfully, I learned a lot about how some

children miss out on language experiences when they are young, and some schools in England help children from the age of 2 and 3. Caralee and Meerilinga have been shortlisted for \$100 000.0<mark>0 to set up a</mark> 'pre-kindy' program to help Aboriginal children before they come to Kindergarten. The knowledge and information provided by the English schools I visited has been very helpful in preparing for the final presentation night this Thursday. Fingers crossed we win!!


