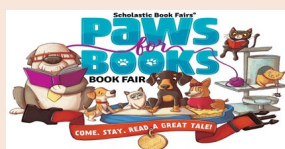

Teaching our kids about good saving habits!

The **School Banking** program has been run nationally by the Commonwealth Bank since 1931. All you need to get involved in the School Banking program is a Commonwealth Bank **Youthsaver** account. You can open an account for your child in one of two ways:

- 1. Online:** Visit commbank.com.au/schoolbanking and click on the link to open a **Youthsaver** account.
- 2. In branch:** Visit a Commonwealth Bank branch with identification for yourself and your child, like a driver's licence and birth certificate.

If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank **Youthsaver** account, they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit on **School Banking Day** using their Dollarmites deposit wallet.

School Banking Day is **Thursday**. Each week you need to bring the deposit book up to the **Front Office**. You will also have the chance to receive a range of items to help you save.

Music Miss Lehani Williams

In Music towards the end of Term 1, **Years 2 to 4** achieved their fourth ukulele chord: a tricky three finger chord - G major. Students were beginning to learn and play new songs during a single lesson, the latest being *Riptide* by Vance Joy, played by some of the older students.

Years 5 and 6 were sight reading a two minute djembe arrangement and time keeping as a whole class with accuracy. The levels of talent and dedication to the music program during Term 1 have been very inspiring.

Music classes will begin again in Term 3. This term students will be strutting their moves as Taylah returns to teach brand new dances with Caralee Dance.

We look forward to some great performances.

Visual Arts Mrs Craen

This term in Visual Arts, we want to encourage individuality and creativity when students are creating their art pieces. Each class has had the use of different art supplies from oil pastels to paint to charcoal, and are also focusing on Elements of Art.

In Term 1, Upper Year students have studied various tree shapes for an upcoming project. They also learnt simple brushes can produce many textures, for example: stipples, dots, smooth lines, wavy lines and speckles.

DI used this brush stroke experience to create three trees which can be viewed on the Art Room window. There you will find various fig shape trees, vase shape trees and whimsical trees.

Lower Primary students have had the opportunity to study *Henri Matisse's "The Goldfish"*, and experimented with guided drawing and using tempera paints. Tempera paint is a fast drying painting medium, and by adding water it changes the colour pigments to activate the paint.

Producing *Matisse's* artworks are always exciting for students because they will always create something that is expressive, colourful and joyful.

B5 learned about shapes, lines, composition and colours and created either a single pair or an array of pears. As a whole class we talked about the shapes of pears and viewed some of *Cézanne*, and *Van Gogh's* still life pear paintings. We talked about the colour we could view and how it made us feel. Then we looked into the shape of a pear starting with the big circle as the bottom and a hill on top with a rectangle as a stem. Then as a class, we discussed the composition from a single pair while other pairs were more grouped in the paintings. The biggest focus for B5 was making sure that they had fun and that they were proud of their pears.

Also in Term 1, Mr Sam Atkins and I were selecting students from D2, D4 and D3 to be in the **Art Extension program**. Students from these classes were given two tasks to complete in-house which have been a "White and Black tree study" and "Faces" which linked in with their Harmony Day poster.

Students' "Tree" perspective consists of students identifying colour, shading, space, lines, textures and contrast in their black and white tree painting, and their "Faces" art pieces linked in with the same art elements and with the Harmony Day theme of "belonging as one". Congratulations to the students who received a letter for the Art Extension program, we look forward to seeing the Art produced in this class.

This term, students are entering a couple of Art competitions.



The **Therapy Focus** competition features "If I Met a Baboon Who Lost His Balloon". This is a story about "friendship". Students will select a page from the story and draw and colour a picture to compliment the page. If students work are selected by judges, they can have their work printed in a story book. The book is distributed around Western Australia for classes to use.

We also will be looking at some competitions that link in with the **Royal Show** and "Sustainability".

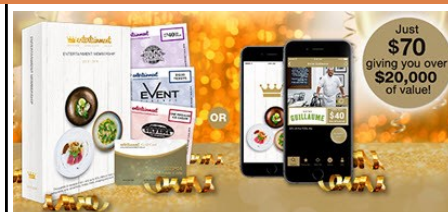

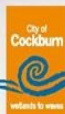
