### When is the sprinkler ban in place?

A permanent winter sprinkler ban applies to all scheme and bore water users in Perth, Mandurah and some parts of the South West, from I June to 31 August each year.

Hand held watering and maintenance testing of bores is still permitted, but anyone using their sprinklers between June and August risks a \$100 fine.

A malfunctioning irrigation controller is not an excuse for not complying with the winter ban, so check the settings on your irrigation system - especially after a power outage.




Junior students have been arranging different rhythms and performing them with un-tuned percussion instruments.
