When is the sprinkler ban in place?

A permanent winter sprinkler ban applies to all scheme and bore water users in Perth, Mandurah and some parts of the South West, from 1 June to 31 August each year.

Hand held watering and maintenance testing of bores is still permitted, but anyone using their sprinklers between June and August risks a \$100 fine.

A malfunctioning irrigation controller is not an excuse for not complying with the winter ban, so check the settings on your irrigation system – especially after a power outage.

Enrolment at High School



Applications for High School are needed NOW.

Don't miss out on selecting your Year 7 options for high school!

All Year 6 students must be enrolled at high school by 5 July 2019. High Schools would like your enrolment as soon as possible to help with planning and so that students do not miss out on being able to select subject preferences.

It is especially important that enrolment forms and associated paperwork are sent as early as possible for students who have learning difficulties and disabilities.

Some families may be unsure which school they will be attending. This may be because they are waiting for Gifted and Talented or Specialist Program offers or late offers from schools out of area. Families must still enrol their child in their local school by July 5 if they have not received an offer by this time. If a late offer comes from an alternative school, families can cancel the first application.

Students must be in the Melville SHS local intake area. Only students accepted into the Gifted and Talented Program or Specialist Programs are accepted out of area. Please check our website for the local intake area map.

If you have lost your application, they are available at your primary school administration.

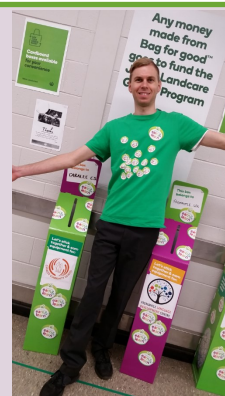

This week in Art, the Yr 2's have finished their Aboriginal inspired art work. We have learned about dot paintings and x-ray style art. They have completed some amazing art work

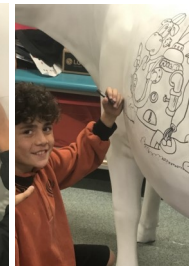
