Enrolment at High School



All Year 6 students must be enrolled at high school by 5 July 2019. High Schools would like your enrolment as soon as possible to help with planning and so that students do not miss out on being able to select subject preferences.

It is important that enrolment forms and associated paperwork are sent as early as possible for students who have learning difficulties and disabilities.

Some families may be unsure which school they will be attending. This may be because they are waiting for Gifted and Talented or Specialist Program offers or late offers from schools out of area. Families must still enrol their child in their local school by July 5 if they have not received an offer by this time. If a late offer comes from an alternative school, families can cancel the first application.

Students must be in the Melville SHS local intake area. Only students accepted into the Gifted and Talented Program or Specialist Programs are accepted out of area. Please check our website for the local intake area map.
